**Opplication** or Advancing the Gospel
Nothing will melt the heart of stinginess, opening the hand clutched tightly around stuff, like grace.

Has grace changed your heart toward stuff? How?

Are you more satisfied by God or in the gifts He provides for you to enjoy? Are there some things you are more prone to enjoy than God? Why? How can you combat that this week?

Read Exodus 40:33b-38. The wilderness now becomes the testing grounds of their loyalty and genuine faith! The same is true of us: God requires heartfelt trust of us for the long haul. Is your journey toward the Promised Land always easy? How do you keep going when it isn't easy? What's the motivation when it isn't working like you thought it would (or were told it would)?
