Citations from the Church

"It is possible to know Bible stories, yet miss the Bible story, " Edmund Clowney.

What do you think Clowney means about "Bible stories" versus "Bible story?" What is *the* Bible story? How does your favorite Bible story fit into that greater story of Jesus' redemption of man?

"The most important date in church history was 1909 when Henry Ford designed his Model-T. Church discipline is almost impossible in the era of the automobile, because we have the ability to run when our church comes after us," Carl Trueman. What are your thoughts on this quote? Why do you think it's just easier for some people to walk away from the church rather than face discipline or accountability? How can this be changed?

Upplication or Advancing the Gospel

Define hope. What are markers of hope in your life? How is Christian hope altogether different from worldly hope? Remember: hope is desire with reasonable confidence, expectancy, longing.

How does an eye to end times motivate a life of hope and holiness? List a few examples. There's great hope in eternity and judgment as Christians. In what ways does this propel urgency as well?

What are some implications of the fact that there are no promises of God contained in the Bible that do not find their ultimate fulfillment in Christ?

Do you believe the visible church is the Body of Christ and indispensable to your life and walk as a believer? Why or why not? What does this mean for membership, attendance, and discipline?

How does being committed to the local church impact the various areas of your life? In what ways does your connectedness matter to others?
