Do you agree with this quote? Why or why not? What are some implications of this? Why do you think this is the case? What do you think are ways we can combat that in our lives?

"God is to be our treasure, and hence believers are to give generously and freely. For most believers in the West, that means giving more than a tithe," Thomas Schreiner. Do you agree or disagree with him? Why or why not? Given current giving patterns and trends in the West, how do you think people would respond to the idea of giving more than ten percent of their income to God? How can that be changed?

Upplication or Advancing the Gospel

Why do you think the Bible has as much to say about money and possessions as it does (17/38 parables, 2,350 times in the Bible, twice as much as faith and prayer combined, 1:7vv in NT)?

In what ways do you see the extravagant grace of God resulting in extravagant, even radical responses of generosity in our lives? Or if you don't, why?

Why do you think Paul appeals to the gospel (8:9) as the motivational ground of our generosity?

As you think about the thousands of needs around you, how do you determine which ones are worth giving to and investing in? In the grand scheme of things, and according to this passage, what should all of our generosity advance? Why?

What prevents you from living with extravagant generosity, whether it's your financial giving, use of time and talents, or even in your pursuit of those who are different from you? What needs to change?
